### **Description**

We all like tales and stories - not only kids do. All the evidence shows that storytelling and tales slowly disappeared from classroom lessons, due to a misbelief that stories and pictures do not fit into scientific thinking as they displace the crystal-clear logical train of thought.

The VoiceThread storyteller gives us the technical possibility to insert media elements (text, sound, image, video) into a presentation, a chronology (timeline) easily and quickly. The comic-style story can be shared with students, embedded in other applications and, as the story can be commented on by students in writing and orally (webcam, microphone), it can be collaborative.

After registration we can start creating our own content by clicking on Create, where we can upload documents, images, audio, video and more.



### **Advantages**

- can be integrated with Canvas
- both verbal and written comments are possible
- it is easier to explain something "in person"
- different points of view can be confronted
- makes online communication and education more personal
- there is a configuration where students do not to see each other's comments

#### **Disadvantages**

- some students feel less comfortable speaking on video
- students may find the interface difficult to navigate at first

#### **Usage in teaching/learning**

The teacher can upload and share documents, presentations, images, audio or video files with students. Both the teacher and the students can comment on the posted material.

Some ideas for using the tool:

 Publish something you want to receive feedback on (e.g. student's work drawing, writing, etc.).

- Discuss a topic, a reading or an image.
- Raise a topic and brainstorm ideas.


## **Timeline**
