Teach students synonymous expressions for like / dislike.	5-20 min	T-Ss Ss-T	HANDOUT 1 Students may make their own wordlist by Wordart	Pre-teaching words The students are introduced to the following words and phrases: Handout 1: A collection of environmental-related words. Students will discuss the meanings of the words and place them in the right columns. The teacher explains the words in English! Example: Contamination is the synonym of pollution. Hazard is the synonym of danger, but it is a more serious danger. CHORAL REPETITION The students will practice pronunciation with the help of the teacher. Difficult words should be pronounced by each student.

Practice	SPEAKING WRITING	The students should be able to collaborate in groups. They should be able to give clear and comprehensible instructions to ChatGPT. They have to learn the importance of clear commands.	15-40	T-S S-S	ChatGPT SAMPLE 1	TASK Each group has to generate a realistic photo of 1 type of pollution with the inclusion of a story. The students have to be smart to give a detailed command to ChatGPT to make the picture realistic and detailed. The teacher may show his own story first to help the students. (Example: a lonely squirrel is crying alone in the middle of a deforestation. Why is deforestation dangerous? What can it cause?) The teacher selects the speakers in each group, who will tell the story of the generated picture. (PROBLEM) If smartphones, or the internet are not accessible for the students: The teacher asks the prompts that students would like to type to ChatGPT, and he will generate the pictures on his own computer based on the students' prompts.

On the other hand, the students have to generate a podcast in the topic of E. pollution by Notebook LM. They have to write their own prompts, which will make the podcasts unique in the case of each student. (The teacher shows the students how to use Notebook LM.)

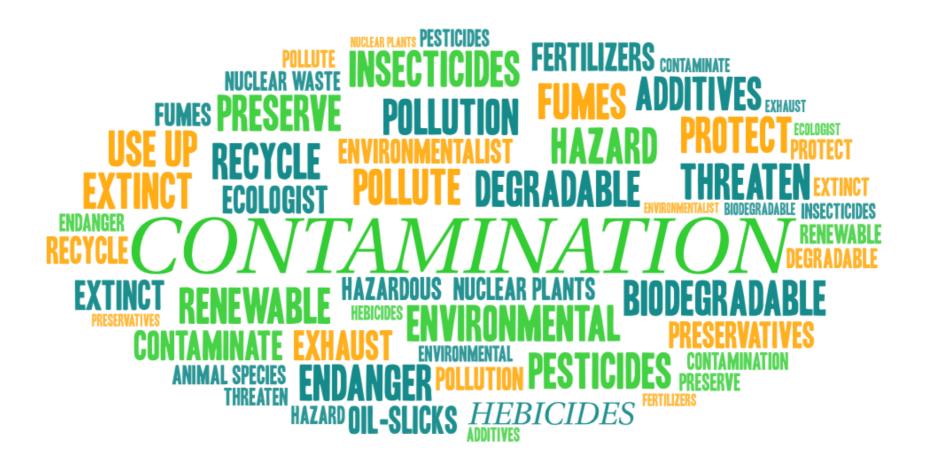
Here are the four realistic photos depicting different kinds of environmental pollution!
